Subject—Social Problems in India (option- II)

Co 2	Structural Issues and Inequalities based on Caste, Class, Gender and Ethnicity are discussed in detail.
Co 3	Students also study problem of Communalism and Minorities their causes and impact on society.
Co 4	Social Problems like Female Foeticide, Dowry, Domestic Violence, Problem of Aged and Divorce their causes, impact and suggestions to eradicate these problems are discussed in detail.
Co 5	Problems like Crime, Juvenile delinquency, Corruption, Drug Addiction, Suicide, Prostitution and AIDS which lead to social disorganization are discussed
Co 6	Students are introduced with various social institutions like Marriage, Family, Kinship and Religion. They came to know about its importance, forms and functions etc.

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
