



COLLEGE PROFILE

D.A.V College for Girls, Yamuna Nagar, is a premier educational institution of the northern region of India. Accredited 'B++' by NAAC, the College has the rare distinction of being chosen as 'The College with Potential for Excellence' by UGC in the second phase too and also as 'The Best Women College' by Kurukshetra University. Over the years, the College has evolved into a brand in female education. The long and impressive list of achievements over the last decade is a testimony to its expanding footprint and impact across northern regions of our country.

A multi-faculty, post-graduate institution, D.A.V. College for Girls offers a wide choice of courses in all disciplines-humanities, science and commerce with 13 Post Graduate courses including PG Diplomas, 6 Honors courses, 17 UGC sponsored Add-on-Courses, 05 Certificate and Diploma courses and 23 Hobby courses to an impressive strength of approximately 3000 students. The College reached an important milestone on being included in the list of 48 colleges/universities selected out of 702 for establishing DDU KAUSHAL Kendra by UGC under the XII Plan of Government of India. Under this scheme, the college has introduced 6 B.Voc., M.Voc. and 7 courses under Community Colleges.

Realising the rapid changes and advances in technology and the growing needs of our smart and gadget-savvy students, the college continues to add and update the existing infrastructure and offers the best of the facilities within its wi-ficollege campus. With Entrepreneur Resource Planning (ERP), the college enables on-line registration, admission, lessons, notices, attendance and also more efficient office-administration. With 5 academic blocks including 68 classrooms, 72 labs including 8 smart class rooms/seminar rooms, an air-conditioned library providing access to e-publication through INFLIBNET and DELNET networks, 2 air-conditioned Audio-Visual rooms, state- of-the-art Mass Communication Lab, Naturopathy Centre with excellent facilities like Sauna Bath, Jacuzzi, Steam Bath, a Gym fitted with latest machines and gadgets, A Shooting Range, Rain Water Harvesting Plant, a state-of-the-art Swimming Pool, a fleet of buses, Surfing Cell for students, Fire-Fighting System and a fully air-conditioned Auditorium with a capacity of 500 seats, and a huge outdoor stage with latest lighting and equipments, Solar Energy Plant (SEP) of 100 KW each in the college and the hostel, all constitute part of the massive infrastructure consolidated over the last decade.

In addition to this, the college also has a hostel which can accommodate more than 650 students from suburbs and neighbouring states in two hostel buildings and makes every possible effort to make their stay here homely and comfortable with a modern kitchen, 24 hour power back-up, internet facility, 4 common rooms, 9 guest rooms, a tuck-shop, washing machines with 50 kg load capacity, a Tumble Dryer, a Hydro Extractor and a Gym.

The college has been recording excellent academic achievements of our students year after year. With 35 university positions in Kurukshetra University examinations held last session, our students have proved their academic excellence yet again.

In cultural activities, our college has proved its superiority among all the colleges of Kurukshetra University. This year in the 44th Zonal Youth Festival held from Dec. 20-22, 2021 at D.A.V. College, Sadhaura, our students participated in 22 cultural items out of which 5 items were recommended & 5 commended. In this competition our students won Overall Trophy in Literary events.

For years together the college has stood first in women colleges of Kurukshetra University. With professional coaching, special training, hard-work and zeal, this year our students have won 18 Gold Medals, 33 Silver Medals and 9 Bronze Medals in various competitions at national and state level.

The N.S.S. and N.C.C. units of the college organise activities and camps for the students to develop their organizational skills and to create opportunities for them to realize their true potential and become responsible citizens and confident individuals. For the last 19 years the N.S.S. unit of the college has been organising blood donation camp annually to make students aware and conscious of their duty and feel proud of their unique gift of life to the needy.

The women cell of the college also organises activities for the students to make them aware of their legal rights, instill in them a consciousness and desire to live with dignity and self-esteem. The various clubs in the college like Eco-Club, Scholars' Club, Youth Club and Red-Ribbon Club also provide the students opportunities to express their creativity, cultivate their special interests and commitment to social cause.

Besides the regular courses, the college also runs 3 UGC centres: Women Studies Centre, Gandhian Studies Centre and Nehru Studies Centre which are basically engaged in research projects but also offer short-term courses to the students to acquaint them with the life, philosophy and vision of these great men and their relevance in the modern world.

Realizing the responsibility of the college towards substantial help to the students in finding jobs in an atmosphere of cut-throat competitions, the placement cell of the college does a commendable job by arranging campus placements for the students to give them an initial push in the professional world. When used skillfully, desktop printing allows the user to produce a wide variety of materials, from menus to magazines and books, without the expense of commercial printing.

3. Theater and Television

The objective of this course is to impart comprehensive training, both practical and theoretical, in various aspects of theatre and television. A student is trained to develop his mind, body and voice. The course aims at the total development of the student's personality. Acting, movement, voice, production, speech, singing, improvisation, theatre-games, yoga, mime, text-study style, character-building, stage make-up, use and control of imagination constitute the integral part of the practical training. Representative plays from Indian and Western dramatic literature and the history of theatre and television are dealt with in considerable detail. Practical lessons in stage lighting, set and costume designing are also imparted. The knowledge of regional theatre-forms and their creative application in the modern context is emphasized. After completion of this course, the students can find jobs as actors, producers, directors, stage-craft incharges and much more.

4. Medical Lab Technology (Eligibility: 10+2 Medical/Non Medical)

Medical Lab Technology, also called clinical laboratory science, is an allied health profession concerned with diagnosis, treatment and prevention of disease through the use of clinical lab tests. The course provides for two levels of job as technologists and technicians. A technologist deals in Blood-banking, Clinical Chemistry, Hematology (blood related), Immunology, Microbiology, Urinalysis, Serology. A technician is engaged in the routine lab testing and works under technologists or supervisors.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO UNDER GRADUATE COURSES

B.A.

A candidate who has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of the Board of School Education, Haryana or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with atleast 33% marks in aggregate with English as one of the subjects, shall be eligible to join 1st Semester of the course.

B.A. (Mass Communication)

A person who has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) from the Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent examination with English as one of the subjects with at least 50% marks in the aggregate shall be eligible to join the first year of Mass Communication Course.

B.A. Hons./B.Sc. Hons.

A person who has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) from the Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent examination with English as one of the subjects and has also obtained 50% marks in the aggregate or 50% marks in subject offered for the Honours Course shall be eligible to join the First year (Part I) class of the B.A. Honours/B.Sc. Honours Course.

B.Sc.

A candidate shall be eligible to join the first year of B.Sc., if she has passed Senior Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent examinations thereto in Science Group with English as one of the subjects and has obtained at least 40% marks in aggregate.

B.Sc. (Home-Science)

A candidate shall be eligible to join the first year of B.Sc. (Home Sc.), if she has passed Senior Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent examinations in Science/Arts/Commerce Group with English as one of the subjects and has obtained at least 40% marks in aggregate.

B.Sc. (Fashion Designing)

A candidate who has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of Board of School Education, Haryana (any stream-Arts, Science, Commerce) / B.Sc.-I Home Science examination holder old scheme of Kurukshetra University or any other examination recognized by the Academic Council as equivalent thereto with at least 45% marks in the aggregate and with English as one of the subjects, shall be eligible to join the first year (Part-I) of this course.

BCA

A candidate who has passed 10+2 examination or any other examination recognised as equivalent thereto, obtaining at least 50% marks in the aggregate, shall be eligible to join First Semester of the course.

B.Com/B.Com (Hons.)

- A person who has passed any one of the following examinations with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the first year of the Bachelor of Commerce Course.
- b) Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of Board of School Education, Haryana or an Examination recognized by the Academic Council as equivalent thereto with atleast 40% marks in the Commerce Group or 50% marks in Non-Commerce Group (Humanities & Science) and for e-Commerce and Banking & Insurance a person must have 50% marks in Commerce Group and 60% marks in Non Commerce Group.

Note: For Compartment Students

Candidate(s) placed under compartment in one subject only can be admitted provisionally to Part-I of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com/BCA etc. at her own risk/responsibility subject to passing their compartmental subject before commencement of the university examination of 1st semester of the year as per provision of rules, contained in the respective Ordinance. Admissions of all such cases will be subject to their fulfilment of the minimum eligibility conditions.

M.Sc. Comp. Science (Software)

A person who has passed with 50% marks in the aggregate of the B.Sc./B.Com with Computer Science or Computer Applications (Vocational Course) / B.Sc. (Hons.) in Computer Science/BCA or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto, shall be eligible to join this course.

OR

Post B.Sc. Diploma in Computer Science and Applications/Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications/Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Science with at least 50% marks in aggregate. Provided that those students who have passed these One year Diploma Courses must have passed B.Sc. (NonMedical) or B.A. with Mathematics at their graduation level.

OR

B.A. with Comp. Sc. with at least 50% marks in aggregate and having Maths as one of the subjects at graduation level.

M.A. Applied Yoga and Health, M.A. HRVE

A person who has passed Bachelor's degree under 10+2+3 scheme in any discipline from Kurukshetra University with 45% marks in the aggregate or its equivalent examination shall be eligible to join the first semester of the course.

M.Com

A person who has passed with at least 45% marks in the aggregate of the Bachelor of Commerce or Bachelor of Business Administration or Bachelor of Arts/Science with Economics and/or Mathematics examinations of Kurukshetra University or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join this course.

M.A. Economics

A person who has passed B.A with Economics / B.Sc. / B.A. (Hons.) in Economics/B.Com. with at least 45% marks in the subject of Economics or 50% marks in aggregate or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

ELIGIBILITY FOR POST GRADUATE DIPLOMAS

Eligibility for PGDCA/PG Diploma in Translation

A person who has passed Bachelor's degree examination of the Kurukshetra University or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto shall be eligible to join this diploma course.

Eligibility for P.G. Diploma in Nutrition and Dietetics

A Person who has passed Bachelor of Science (Home Science) examination of Kurukshetra University.

OR

B.A. with Home Science as an Elective subject or an Examination recognised as equivalent thereto with at least 50% marks in aggregate (Minimum Pass marks of SC/ST Candidates) shall be eligible to join the Post-Graduate Diploma in Nutrition & Dietetics Course.

Eligibility for P.G. Diploma in Fashion Designing

Minimum 50% marks in aggregate in Bachelors Degree from any stream.

Eligibility for Post Graduate Diploma in Yoga & Naturopathy

(i) B.A./B.Sc./B.Com with at least 45% marks in aggregate and having passed English as one of the subjects, except for B.Sc., B.Com and B.A. (Hons.) having passed English at least in one year.

OR

(ii) B.A. with Health & Physical Education as one of the subjects in the three years degree course with at least 45% marks in the aggregate.

OR

(iii) Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P. ed.) 3-years degree course/B.Sc. (Physical Education, Health Education and Sports)/ D.P. ed. one year after graduation with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

Note:

- a) In case of SC/ST candidates minimum pass marks in the qualifying examination will be considered as minimum eligibility condition for admission to a particular course.
- b) Though the minimum percentage of marks fixed by the university is 45% marks (50% in case of M.A., M.Sc.) the admission to all Post Graduate Courses will be on merit basis. As seats are limited, a higher percentage may be fixed by the college to select students for admission.
- c) The Principal of the college will allow provisional admission to the students of Final year of PG Degree without waiting for the declaration of the result of the previous year.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE & RULES

 - Aadhar Card Copy
 - Proof of Blood Group and Haemoglobin (Hb)
 - · Student's Bank Account No. with IFSC Code.
 - Anti-Ragging Form

NOTE

- Principal of the college is authorized to allow provisional admission to former students whose result of B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. Part I, II and M.A. I examination has not yet been declared by the university. If on declaration of result, a student fails, her provisional admission will automatically stand cancelled.
- Failed candidates are not allowed admission in the college.
 However, they can get admission in various courses run under community college.
- Admission of students from other University/Board will be provisional and subject to confirmation of their eligibility by Kurukshetra University.
- 4. If the number of students in any course is less than ten, the college will not run that particular course and the students will be allowed to shift to some other course.

USEFUL INFORMATION

RAGGING

Ragging in educational institutions is banned and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately. The punishment may include the shape of (i) withholding scholarship or other benefits (ii) debarring from representation in events (iii) withholding results (iv) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess, and the like. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

The following will be termed as the act of ragging: Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, including in rowdy or indisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE

As per UGC guidelines, the college has set up an Internal Complaint Committee to deal with the issues related to eveteasing, sexual assault, abuse or molestation reported by the students and the women employees of the college. The cell aims at upholding the dignity of women and facilitate a gender-sensitive and congenial environment for women.

IDENTITY CARD

An Identity Card is an important document and should be carried at all times in college as it identifies a student as a member of the college community. It can be checked at any time by any member of the staff. In case a student loses her card or needs to replace the damaged card, a duplicate ID Card can be issued on payment of additional fee of Rs. 50/-.

PRAYER

The college holds prayer daily for 15 minutes. It includes Vedic Hymns and popular prayers. It is compulsory for all the students to attend the prayer daily. All the important announcements pertaining to the students are made in the prayer time.

HAWAN

Hawan is performed twice a year at the beginning and at the end of the session. Spiritual speakers are also invited on these occasions to address the students.

MENTOR-MENTEE PROGRAMME

Mentor-Mentee Programme focuses on providing successful and satisfied relation between mentor and mentee, so that mentees can achieve higher performances, feel rejuvenated and become aware of issues, methods or perspectives that are important in their lives. This program will benefit both the mentor and mentee as it involves interaction and one to one conversation. Each student is encouraged to achieve her potential, aspirations, self confidence and improved skills.

INFORMATION PERTAINING TO ACADEMICS

Change of Subject / Faculty

A student of an undergraduate course may be permitted to change her subject (s) or faculty within one month of the commencement of the session. After that no student will be allowed to change the subject or faculty.

Attendance

A candidate who has not attended 75% lectures in theory/practical as prescribed by the Ordinances of the University and the deficiency thereof has not been condoned by the Principal, shall not be eligible to appear in the examination.

Internal Assessment

There shall be 20% marks earmarked for Internal Assessment in each theory paper of all Semesters to be awarded by the class teachers calculated/based upon students' performance in college tests/ assignments and attendance in each subject according to the following criteria:

- 1. Two Handwritten Assignments 10%
- 2. One Class Test 5%
- 3. Attendance 5%

Marks for Attendance will be given as under:

1) 91% onwards : 5 marks
2) 81% to 90% : 4 marks
3) 75% to 80% : 3 marks
4) 70% to 74% : 2 marks*
5) 65% to 69% : 1 mark*

*For students engaged in co-curricular activities for the college only / authenticated medical grounds duly approved by the concerned Principal.

Women Cell

Regularly organizes talks and seminars concerning vital women issues and creates an awareness among students about their rights, duties, responsibilities and building confidence among them.

Women Studies Centre

The UGC sanctioned Women Studies Centre, only one of its kind in northern states, is basically engaged in projects related to women issues.

Nehru Studies Centre

The UGC-sanctioned Nehru Studies Centre is engaged in lectures, research and extension activities related to Nehru.

Gandhian Studies Centre

The objective of the centre is to promote, organise and undertake the study of life and thought of Mahatma Gandhi. Its aim is to promote activities both for the younger generation and for the more mature Gandhian activists and workers to translate the same into social life for the benefit of the nation.

Parent Teacher Association

Parent Teacher Association provides a platform to discuss the difficulties faced by the students and also helps in exploring the hidden potential of the students in the right direction.

Red Ribbon Club

The Red Ribbon Club creates awareness among students about HIV/AIDS. It helps to induce among youth the spirit to help and support people living with HIV/AIDS.

Remedial Coaching Centre

Remedial Coaching for SC/OBC/ Minority aims at improving the academic skills and knowledge of students in various subjects. The basic objective of the Remedial Coaching Centre is to raise their level of comprehension of basic subjects and to provide a strong foundation for further academic progress and thus reduce their failure and drop-out rate.

Competitive Exams Coaching Centre

Under the UGC scheme of coaching for Services Competitive Exams, this centre aims at preparing students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/Minority Communities to get gainful employment in central govt. and other services like Banks. The students belonging to the weaker sections of the society and physically challenged students may also avail of this facility. The students of general category can also get benefit of this facility on the payment of a nominal fee.

Road Safety Club

In a bid to enable the students to imbibe the importance of practicing safety norms while driving on the road, the college has formed Road Safety Club. The club comprises of a nodal officer, institute head or convenor, two senior faculty members, regional eminent person and 40 senior students who are appointed as members. Six Road Safety Ambassadors have also been appointed. Awareness talks, quiz, seminars, workshops, poster making are organized in the Road Safety Clubs.

Personal Counseling Cell

For the effective redressal of problems and challenges faced by students, the college has a Personal Counseling Cell and a qualified and trained psychologist to take care of their anxiety, stress, fear of change & failure and a slew of other academic worries. It is a unique, interactive and target-oriented system involving students, teachers and parents to address common student concerns. It bridges formal as well as communicative gaps between the students and institution at large. To cater the emotional and intellectual needs of students and to guide them to move up in their career, this centre has three segments.

- a. Tutorial Board
- b. PDP (Personality Development Program) Cell
- c. Counseling Cell.

COLLEGE BUS RULES

- 1. Once enrolled for the college bus, no student can leave the bus without depositing 12 months college bus fee.
- 2. Students can deposit college bus fee only in two equal installments.
- No college bus facility will be given to the students to the particular pick-up point on the link-road unless there are minimum 5 students.
- 4. No student will get the Roll No. for university examination without depositing the college bus fee for full year.

VEHICLE PARKING RULES

- 1. Students coming to college on cycles/scooters must acquire cycle/scooter token from the college office.
- Students must park their bicycles/scooters in the Underground Parking Area. Vehicles parked anywhere else inside/outside the college shall be confiscated.
- Students must lock their vehicles positively. However, in case of loss of a vehicle the college shall not be responsible.
- 4. Students will have to pay Rs. 300/- as Cycle charges and Rs. 600/- as Scooter charges per academic session.
- All the students who use two wheelers must wear helmets daily.

LEAVE RULES

- Leave must be applied for in advance on leave forms available on student account (website).
- On days when special functions are held, leave shall be granted only by the Principal. In case of absence fine will be imposed.
- In case of serious illness, the leave application must be submitted alongwith the medical certificate signed by the Chief Medical Officer of the district.
- 4. The maximum leave allowed during the year will be 15 days only. Extra leave / medical leave for more than 15 days shall automatically be cancelled and the student shall be fined Rs. 5/per lecture/day. No lecture will be given against the leave sanctioned.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- A student on rolls of the college shall be bound by the college rules and regulations.
- 2. Students are prohibited from organizing or attending meetings in the college, distributing notices, collecting money and exhibiting banners, posters etc. without the permission of the principal.
- 3. Students are not allowed to bring outsiders to the college.
- Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college and hostel campus.
 Assaulting, harassment or threatening other students is strictly prohibited.
- A student found guilty of misconduct, damaging the dignity of self and the institution.
- 6. Students found damaging/disfiguring lab equipment, library books, computers, furniture, walls, etc. would be severely punished.
- 7. Use of mobile phone in the class rooms, labs and corridors is strictly prohibited for personal use. Any student using a mobile phone in the above mentioned places will be fined Rs. 1000/and her phone will be confiscated. The mobile must be kept on 'switched off' mode in the college campus. However, a student can use her mobile phone in the presence of her teacher for academic purpose or in case of any emergency.

- Students must be punctual and regular in attending their classes and the labs. In case of mass bunk, the whole class will be fined.
- Students who do not obtain the required attendance percentage (75%), fail to submit assignments in time and remain absent from conditional test for unjustified reasons will not be allowed to appear in the university examination.
- Students should go to the library or sit in the common room or shed area in their vacant period. Loitering in veranda and chitchatting/gossiping in the corridors will be viewed seriously.
- 11. Wearing identity cards in the college is compulsory.
- It is compulsory for the students of all vocational courses to wear uniform on all days. Students are expected to come to the college decently dressed.
- Students are expected to treat the members of the staff both, teaching and non teaching, and also their fellow students with courtesy.
- 14. All the students are supposed to consult the Notice Board daily. Ignorance of orders duly displayed on notice-board shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.
- 15. During Prayer time students must stop working and sing/recite the Prayer and also listen carefully the important announcements made during this time.
- 16. Do not litter your class-rooms and campus with wrappers and papers. Use dustbins which you will find in every room at every floor of the college. Dustbins near the canteen are labeled as dry, wet, organic and e-waste. You are expected to put garbage in the dustbins according to the label on them.
- 17. Students will not be allowed to leave the college premises for any personal work till 12:15 pm. In case of emergency, the permission of the principal, on the request of parents or signature of the head of the department, is mandatary.
- Students must clear their pending fee (College/Bus) by the due date as fixed by the college. Otherwise, NOC for university roll no. will not be issued.

HOSTEL RULES

ADMISSION

- 1. Admission will be sought afresh every academic session.
- 2. Hostel Dues as decided by the Management will be payable for the whole year in advance at the time of admission. In no case, the fee once paid shall be refunded.
- 3. The Hostel Security is non refundable.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. It is compulsory for all the parents to attend the schedule parents teacher meetings.
- 2. It is mandatory for all the students to go to the college and come back from the college by bus.
- 3. No outside tuitions will be allowed. If required, the tuition facility will be given in the Hostel itself arranged by the college authorities.
- Outing is permitted on every Sunday from 10.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. However, on all other days the students will purchase their required items from Hostel Shop only.
- 5. Study hours will be observed from 9:45 p.m. to 12:00 p.m. After that the lights will be switched off. They must be in their room from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am. If any student is found absent from her room or moving about during the mentioned hours, it will be viewed very seriously.
- 6. If parents want to call their wards home in case of emergency, they have to inform the Principal as well as the Warden.
- 7. Fee of any kind once paid will not be refundable.
- 8. Parents are advised to check the attendance of their wards in college and hostel.
- 9. Residents are advised not to keep excessive cash, jewellery or other valuable items with them. The hostel does not take any responsibility in this matter.
- 10. The students must vacate hostel room the very next day after their exams are over.
- 11. Students on leave from hostel will be fined Rs. 100/per day if they overstay their sanctioned leave.
- 12. Any hostel student found skipping classes and staying in hostel without the permission of the hostel warden will be fined Rs. 100/- per day.

ATTENDANCE & LEAVE

- If the student fails to come back after the lapse of the period of sanctioned leave, she herself will be responsible for the consequences thereof. Leave will be sanctioned only on the leave form available online.
- A boarder will have to seek permission from the warden for any kind of absence from hostel.
- 3. If any student extends her leave, the parents should inform the hostel-warden within 24 hours. Otherwise, serious action will be taken against the student.
- 4. Warden can sanction leave upto 2 days only. Any leave more than that needs to be sanctioned by the Principal.
- 5. Medical leave will be sanctioned if only the regular doctor appointed for hostelers approves of it.
- 6. Boarder will have to attend the prayer daily at 6:00 p.m. in the campus.
- 7. The hostel gate will be closed at 5:00 p.m. The defaulters will have to face consequences whatsoever.

VISITORS & GUESTS

- 1. Visitors are allowed only on visiting days (Holidays & Sundays) between 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- 2. Single male/female shall not be considered as local guardian. Only a married couple above 30 years is eligible to be the local guardian.
- Only those male visitors whose photographs are pasted on hostel form will be allowed on showing the gate pass issued by the college to meet the respective student in the reception room.

- 4. Parents can call the wards on telephone from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. only.
- 5. No Parents/Guardians (Male/Female) are allowed to go to the residents' room.
- 6. Parents will be allowed to stay in the hostel guest room (general) only on payment of Rs. 250/- per head/per day and will have to pay Rs. 150/-extra for meals per day. Other guests will be charged Rs. 1000/- per day for (VIP) guest room and Rs. 150/- for meals per day.
- 7. A day scholar is not permitted to visit or stay in the hostel without the permission of the principal.

CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

- 1. A student shall maintain discipline & peaceful atmosphere in the hostel.
- 2. Electrical appliances like Iron, tape-recorder, etc. are not allowed.
- 3. Picture pasting is strictly prohibited. Room walls should be kept clean. For any damage to the furniture/furnishing student will be fined.
- 4. The hostelers will have to keep Id-Card with them to be shown at the gate.
- Hostelers are not permitted to approach any other doctor for medical care other than the one appointed by the college authorities.
- 6. Cooking in the room is prohibited. Defaulters will be fined Rs. 500/- per student.
- 7. Attending evening assembly is compulsory for all students.
- 8. No participation of any resident in politics will be tolerated.
- 9. The residents are expected to be decently dressed up in the hostel campus.

MESS RULES

- Besides the hostel committee, a mess-committee of the students will be formed for the additional supervision in the preparation of hygienic food for students and to maintain discipline in the mess and hostel premises. In case of any complaint, the matter should be reported to the warden.
- 2. The mess charges @ 27000/- per annum would be charged, payable in two instalments. First instalment of Rs. 14000/- must be deposited at the time of admission and second instalment of Rs. 13000/- before the university examination of odd semester. Additional mess charges will be taken if a student overstays.
- 3. Mess timings and other rules fixed by the warden will be strictly adhered to by the boarders.
